August 14, 1929 - September 5, 2012

Robert "Bob" Heitholt passed away on September 5, 2012 in the Georgia War Veteran's Home of Milledgeville, GA. He was born on August 14, 1929 in Quincy, IL. Bob was a former resident of Perry, GA and Quincy, IL. He was the son of the late Roy and Hazel (Loos) Heitholt. His devoted wife of 58 years, Phyllis (Boland) Heitholt, preceded his death last May 2012. After graduating from Gem City Business College, Bob began his career with Packaging Corporation (later Pactiv) in Quincy before accepting a move to the Macon, GA plant where he was a shift supervisor. After retirement he worked at the Walmart in Warner Robins. In addition, he was active in the National Guard and Army Reserves, obtaining the rank of Captain. He served in Japan during the Korean conflict and was later deployed when the Quincy National Guard was activated in 1961. He was a member of the Masons and the Perry Methodist Church. A 1947 graduate of Quincy High School, Bob was a 3-sport athlete who was a member of the first IHSA State baseball tournament team in 1945. Bob was also an avid golfer.

Bob loved family and friends and his dedication and friendship to others will be missed.

Bob is survived by his son David, daughter Pam Harris, and a cherished grandson Roberts, who made his home with Bob and Phyllis. He is also survived by brothers Dick Heitholt (Fern) of Bloomington, IL and Bill Heitholt

(Dorothy) of Commerce, TX along with special caring cousins, John and Louise Sallstrom of Milledgeville, GA, nephews Chuck and Jim Heitholt and a special niece Becky Berry of Bloomington, IL, The Boland family of Quincy and a special supportive friend Freda Hankins.

In addition to his wife and parents, Bob was preceded in death by nephew, Kent Heitholt of Columbia, MO.
