Mr. Robert Allen "Bob" White, 75, passed away on Wednesday, May 26, 2021. Funeral services will be conducted at 11 AM on Saturday, May 29, 2021 in First United Methodist Church with Rev. Mac Enfinger and Rev. Stephanie Caldwell officiating. Graveside service will follow at 3 PM in Mallorysville Baptist Church in Tignall, Georgia.

The family will receive friends from 10 AM until the service hour in First United Methodist Church.

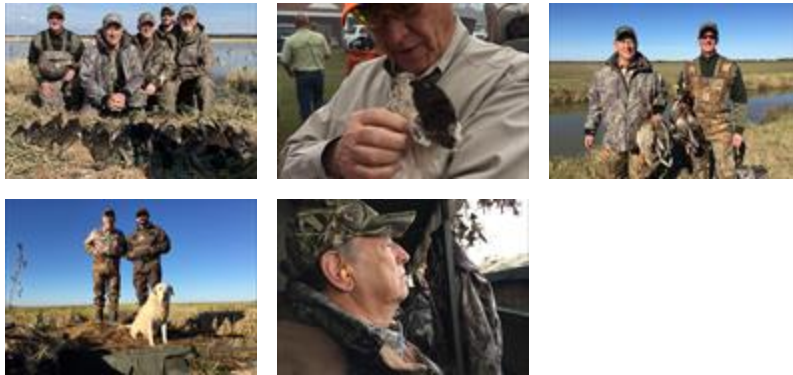
