Mr. David Thomas Griffith, age 77, passed away Saturday, January 19, 2011. Funeral Services will be held Friday, February 25, 2011 at 11AM in the Georgia Veteran's Memorial Cemetery with Rev. Michael Hubbard and Deacon Shayne Barnes officiating.

The family will be at the funeral home Friday from 9:30AM to 10:30AM to receive friends.
