Evelyne Aikens Leverette, age 97, a long time resident of Eatonton, GA, died peacefully Feb. 4, 2013. She was predeceased by her parents, George S. Aikens and Mattie Mae Rogers Aikens and her sisters Eloise Aikens and Virginia A. Everett; widowed from her first husband of 37 years, George F. Ellis and from her second husband of 27 years, H.
