



## Felix Garrett

January 31, 1929 - November 14, 2025

Mr Felix B. Garrett, 96, passed peacefully on Friday, November 14, 2025 in the Memory Care Unit of The Georgia War Veterans in Milledgeville, Ga under the loving care of Georgia Hospice.

He was a native of Texas. He worked as a ranch hand as a young man and played high school football, graduating from Ft Hancock High in 1946. Upon graduation, he joined the U S Army and proudly served 20 years, completing numerous tours of Korea, Japan and Germany. Ultimately landing in Augusta, Ga at Fort Gordon in 1958. He retired in 1966 as Chief Warrant Officer in the Criminal Investigation Division. Following retirement, he attended Augusta State University, completing his Bachelor's degree in 1972.

He went on to pursue a career in the banking industry with the Georgia Railroad Bank & Trust. He retired a second time as Banking Operations Officer in 1986.

He had many interests and hobbies, including car restorations, camping, boating, golf, writing, square dancing and wood working. He enjoyed many years setting up his own wood shop, designing, creating and building all things wood from toys to large pieces of furniture.

He loved to tell stories of his life experiences and never missed an opportunity to tell everyone that he was a cowboy from Texas.

He is survived by his daughters, June Nurnberger (Dal) of Waverly, Ga and Irene Clements (Darryl) of Warner Robins, Ga; a son, Michael Teague (Teri) of

Altamonte Springs, Fl; sister, Mary Jensen of Wisconsin; 3 grandchildren and 5 great grandchildren.

He was predeceased by his wife, Doris Landon Garrett; parents, Felix Garrett and Fern Olivia Herrmann Garrett; sisters, Frances Morris, Olivia Weldon, Joyce Evan's; and grandson, Bradley Morris.

A celebration of life service will be held by the family at a later date following interment at Magnolia Cemetery, Augusta, Ga.
