Mr. Frank B. Chambers, 86, passed away on April 24, 2026. A Graveside Memorial Service will be held on Tuesday, April 28, 2026 at 2 PM in Heritage Memorial Park. The Family will receive friends on Tuesday at First Methodist Church from 12:30 – 1:30.

Mr. Chambers was born in Sandersville to Frank Chambers and Sara Martha Mathis Chambers and was raised in Gordon. He moved to Milledgeville when he was 13 and graduated High School at GMC. He attended Young Harris College and graduated from the University of Georgia. He was a member of ATO Fraternity and made many lifetime friends there. Mr. Chambers was in the real estate business and an appraiser. He was the Chairman of the Board of Wilkinson County Bank. He had been a member of the First Methodist Church, the Baldwin JAYCEES, and was one of the founders of the Ducks Unlimited Chapter in Milledgeville in 1973. 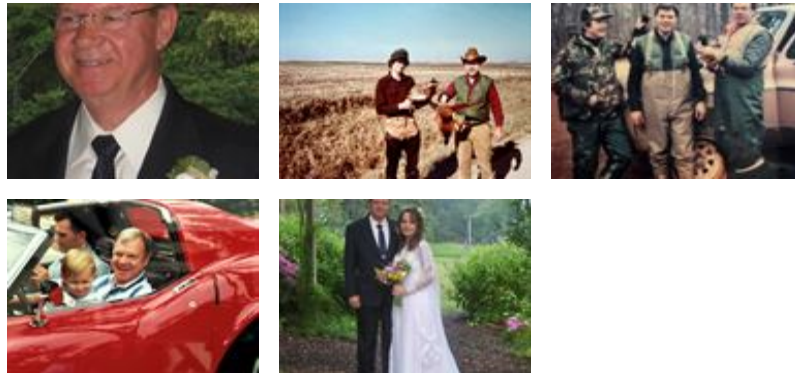
