Helen Paul Stevens, 79, of Lake Sinclair GA., passed away suddenly on Thursday, January 19th at her home.

Helen was born on December 26, 1943, to Archie and Irene Paul in Savannah, GA. She grew up on Isle of Hope in Savannah, the youngest of five siblings.

Upon completing her high school education at Jenkins Highschool, she relocated to North Adams, Massachusetts to reside with her sister. She was quickly employed by the North Adams hospital as a diet aide. It was here in 1962 where she met Francis Melvin Stevens when he refused to be discharged from the hospital and insisted on speaking with her one more time.
