Survivors include her Daughter Marian Kathy Veal-Smith and husband Alan M. Smith. She is also survived by many nieces, nephews, and cousins.

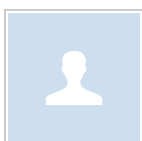
The family will be at the funeral home to receive friends on Saturday from 1 PM until the service hour.
