Marion Jackson “Jackie” Coleman, age 78, of Milledgeville, passed away Tuesday, August 26, 2025. 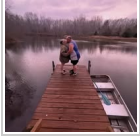

Together, they shared 56 wonderful years filled with love, laughter, and joy as they raised their family.

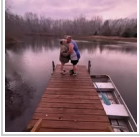
