February 5, 1940 - June 23, 2006

A Native of Union Point, Georgia, Mr. Johnson was the son of the late James Frank and Grace Dwyer Johnson. Mr. Johnson had lived in New York and California while a professional wrestler known as "Crazy Luke Graham". A member of one of the greatest families in pro-wrestling, the Graham family, Mr. Johnson, aka Crazy Luke teamed with Tarzan Tyler to win the first ever WWWF world Tag Team Championship. Other accomplishments include, WWE international Tag Team Champion, WWE United States Tag Team Champion, WWC Caribbean Heavyweight Champion, WWC North American Champion, NWA Central States Heavyweight Champion, NWA Mid America Heavyweight Champion, NWA Mid America Heavyweight Champion, NWA Hawaii Heavyweight Champion, NWA Tag Team Champion. Upon retirement from pro-wrestling, Mr. Johnson returned home to the Athens area. He had lived in Milledgeville for the past year and attended Freedom Church.
