

## Leroy Joseph Oltremari, Jr.

March 4, 1937 - April 3, 2021

Leroy Joseph Oltremari, Jr., age 84, formerly of Milledgeville, passed away Saturday, April 3, 2021. A Celebration of Life for Leroy Oltremari will be conducted Sunday, April 11, 2021 at 2:00pm in the Eatonton Seventh Day Adventist Church with Norman Byers officiating.

Interment will be privately held in the Georgia Veterans Memorial Cemetery in Milledgeville.

The family will receive friends at the Eatonton Seventh Day Adventist Church on Sunday, April 11, 2021 from 1:00pm until 2:00pm.

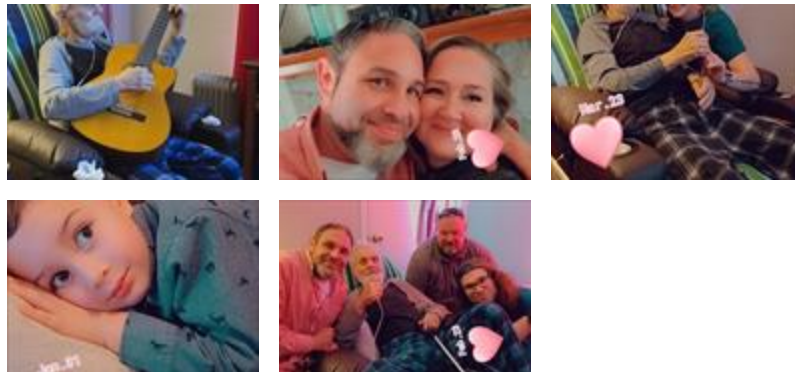
