Mrs. Linda Gray Johnson Cheves, age 74, departed this Earth on Thursday, August 1, 2013 following a long illness. A Visitation will be held on Sunday, August 4, 2013 starting at 5PM with a Memorial Service to follow at Bradley Baptist Church in Gray, GA with Reverend Steve Johnson officiating.

Mrs. Cheves was the daughter of the late Jessie Johnson Watson and the late Herb Johnson, a well-known WMAZ-TV personality in the fifties and sixties. She was a past member of Log Cabin Baptist Church in Macon where she taught Children's Sunday School and Vacation Bible School. She was retired from SunTrust Bank in Macon, was a Realtor for Lane Realty in Eatonton, and for several years she wrote a free-lance column for the Union Recorder in Milledgeville.
