Merion J. Schepper, 93, of 1010 Woodland Terrace, Milledgeville, died at home with her beloved husband by her side on February 27, 2016.

Born in Mount Vernon, New York, in 1922, Merion with her husband, Donald, made her home in Dumont, New Jersey, for most of her adult life. She was a graduate of Luther College (Teaneck, NJ) and an active member of The Reformed Church on the Hill (Cresskill, NJ) and Old North Reformed Church (Dumont, NJ), serving as Deacon and Elder, Adult Bible Class teacher, Youth Group Leader, and choir member. She was also a soloist of the Haworth Choral Society and various churches in New York and New Jersey. Retiring as business manager of Luther College, Teaneck, NJ, in 1990, she and her husband Donald moved to Mt. Pleasant, South Carolina, where she was an active member of Mt. Pleasant Presbyterian Church and served on the Charleston Symphony League. She moved with her husband to the Cottages in Milledgeville in 2005.

Predeceased by her parents, Eugene and Gustave Anderson, and her brother William, Merion was survived by her beloved husband of 73 years, Donald R. Schepper; her children, Jeanette (Thomas) Doyle of Eatonton, Meryl (Geoffrey) Moore of Fareham, England, and William (Carol) Schepper) of Rock Tavern New York; six grandchildren; and three great-grandchildren.
