Mozelle Fain Carnes was born August 21, 1935, to Daisy Lankford Carnes and Olden Evelyn (Ebb) Carnes, Sr. She was the second of two children. She is predeceased by her parents and her brother, Ebb Carnes, Jr.

Mozelle began working for Dr. Jack Griffin as a dental hygienist in 1958 and worked for him until he passed away and Dr. Thomas L. Brown bought his practice. She began working for Dr. Brown in 1969 and worked there Monday through Wednesday until she cleaned her last set of teeth on August 21, 2013. She also worked as a hygienist for Dr. Bailey Crockarell in Jackson, Georgia from 1964 until his retirement in 2005. She truly “lived to work and worked to live” and we don’t think anyone ever loved their job more than her. This year marked 55 years as a hygienist.

Mozelle is predeceased in death by her husband of over 58 years, Talmadge Holder. Mozelle married Talmadge Holder on March 3, 1954. Mozelle had her eye on Talmadge from the time she was in 7th grade. She saw Talmadge washing the windows outside her classroom at school. She told her friend that one day she was going to marry that boy and that she did.
