Owen Pavitt, Age 90, passed away, Saturday, March 13, 2010 in Eatonton. Services were held Friday at the Georgia Veterans Memorial Cemetery in Milledgeville.

Born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, Mr. Pavitt was the son of the late James and Minnie Goodman Pavitt. Mr. Pavitt was a veteran of World War II having served in the United States Navy. He was the widower of Marian Elizabeth Bateman Pavitt.

His acting career began in the late 30's and early 40's on radio and spanned a half century to include Broadway, Television and Hollywood movies. He appeared in the Broadway productions of No Time for Sergeants and the Andersonville Trial. His television credits include Rawhide, Route 66, Combat, Gunsmoke, Donna Reed and Our Man Higgins. Mr. Pavitt appeared Off Broadway and in the Palm Tree, Tampa Playhouse and Cherry Lane Theaters and finished his career producing, directing at the Palm Tree Playhouse.

Mr. Pavitt retired to Eatonton where he played golf, enjoyed life with his friends at Lake Sinclair.

He is survived by a son, Michael Pavitt of Livermore, California and a sister in law, Jean Bateman of Chapel Hill, North Carolina.
