Margaret (Peggy) Ann Bray Rodgers died peacefully after a short illness on Monday, July 4th. She was 88 years old. At the time of her death she was a resident of Milledgeville, Georgia. She was a member of the First United Methodist Church of Milledgeville.

Peggy Bray was born in Atlanta, Georgia. She was the third of six siblings, all of whom have predeceased her. She grew up in North Georgia and in Washington, D.C., where she met and married John W. Rodgers after WWII. The couple had three sons and lived in Washington, in Louisville, Kentucky, and in Tyler, Texas before settling in the Rodgers' home town of Miami, Florida in 1955. She remained a resident of Miami until her retirement in 1993 when she returned to Georgia to live near her children and grandchildren.

After divorcing in 1963, Peggy Rodgers began her long career with the Miami-Dade County School system. Beginning as an office clerk at Shenandoah Junior High School, she progressed through positions with the driver's education department and eventually became administrative assistant to the Superintendent and the Board of Directors at the time of her retirement. Throughout most of this period she resided in the Kendall area of South Dade.

Peggy Rodgers was an avid reader, an excellent cook and hostess, and an accomplished administrator, deservedly proud of her career achievements. But to all who knew her it was clear her life revolved around her children and grandchildren – she loved them all dearly and no doubt viewed her greatest accomplishment as the rearing of three sons (Craig, Lee, and Ralph - and helping them to raise 7 grandchildren and 5 great-grandchildren) who are successful in their own lives, marriages, and families. She was a shining example to them all of sacrifice and unconditional love. May she enjoy God's blessing and the everlasting peace she so richly deserves.

The family will hold a private ceremony celebrating Peggy's life at a future date.
