After a time in her own criminal defense private practice, she started working for Central State Hospital where she worked for over 30 years as the Director of Legal and Special Services. While working for Central State Hospital, she was also able to be the most incredible mom to Lucas Rogers and Stephanie Neal. She welcomed six grandchildren into the world and loved them with her whole heart. After retiring, she dedicated her life to the passionate love of her grandchildren. She and Wayne traveled all over the country in their RV including multiple cross country trips to California.
