



## Thomas Frazier Yeager

February 26, 1931 - August 11, 2025

Thomas Frazier Yeager age 94 of Powder Springs, Georgia passed away on August 11, 2025. He is preceded in death by his parents, Guy A. Yeager and Edna Mae Yeager (Lee) and his wife of 60 years Bonnie Boyd Yeager. He is survived by a sister, Reba Ewing of Powder Springs, a son, Barry Lee Yeager of Decatur and a daughter, Elizabeth (Beth) Yeager Biggs (Tim) of Cincinnati, Ohio. He is also survived by three grandchildren, Lauren Turner (Troydawn) of Kennesaw, Brenna Biggs (Brett Lange) of Cincinnati and Bryan Biggs of Salt Lake City, Utah and one great grandson, Carmen Yeager, of Kennesaw, and a great granddaughter, Ashley Gamble, of Riverdale.

Tom (or Frazier), graduated from Douglas County High School in 1948, Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College in 1950 and Georgia State University in 1958 with a BBA in Accounting. In 1950, he married Bonnie Jean Boyd at Clarkdale United Methodist Church. He served in the Army from 1951-1953 spending 13 months of that time on the front lines in Korea. He was promoted to Master Sergeant and was awarded the Bronze Star.

He was a member of Clarkdale United Methodist Church for 60 years. He was a member of County Line UMC for 12 years. Additionally he was a lifelong automobile enthusiast and was a member of The Model A Restorer's Club for several years before developing his interest in street rods and becoming a

member of Creepers Car Club of Marietta and Georgia Street Rod Association and the National Street Rod Association. He was also involved in local Rotary Clubs in the area, was a member of the Powder Springs Masonic Lodge and a member of the Yaarab Shriners of Atlanta. He was also a member of the American Legion.

He had a long career in the Atlanta area working for various companies prior to joining Cousins Properties. From there he joined a real estate development partnership, Columbia Square. He later formed his own development and management company, The Yeager Company.

After the death of his wife, he resided in Assisted Living in Dallas, Georgia before spending the end of his life in the care of the Georgia War Veterans Home.

A private memorial service will be held by the family at a later date.
