Mr. William Ashley “Tut” Finney passed away April 14, 2015 at his residence. Graveside services will be held at 11:00 AM Friday, April 17, 2015 in the Coopers Baptist Church Cemetery.

William Ashley Finney best known as “Tut” Finney was preceded in death by his father Charles Beauguard Finney, Mother Artie Collins Finney and his sisters; Martha, Lois and Sara Elizabeth.

Mr. Finney was born February 25, 1928 in Umatilla Florida. The family moved to Baldwin County in 1953 and Tut followed in 1955. Tut worked in Stevens Pottery where he was a kiln fireman. He then moved to Griffin Pipe where he worked in the engineering department. In 1980 he started working at McGaw and worked there until he retired in 1985.

After he retired he began working as a wood carver, helping his sister with her apple carving business. They kept this family business alive until 2011 when Sara passed away.

Tut was a photographer in his spare time he enjoyed walking the family farm and taking pictures of the wild life and the flowers and trees.

Tut is survived by his cousins Ruth Minor, Iverna Thomas of Salt Lake, FL and

Lois Ann Misenheimer of Brevard, North Carolina and other out of State cousins.

Tut was a veteran of the Korean War where he served in the army from October 1949 until 1952. He was a combat engineer.
