Victor Curtis Griggers, age 92, of Haddock, passed away on Monday, June 9, 2025. Funeral services for Victor Griggers will be held on Monday, June 23, 2025 at 1 PM in the Georgia Veterans Memorial Cemetery in Milledgeville.

A native of Smyrna, GA, Victor was born on July 16, 1932 to the late Rayford Ezra Griggers and the late Victoria Reed Griggers. Victor has lived in Jones County since the 1980's. 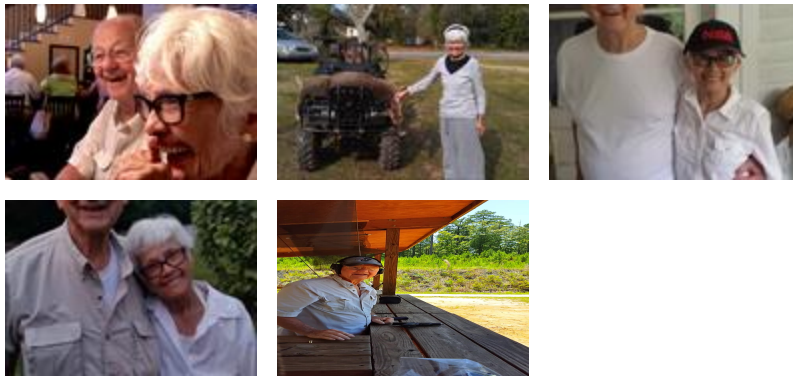
